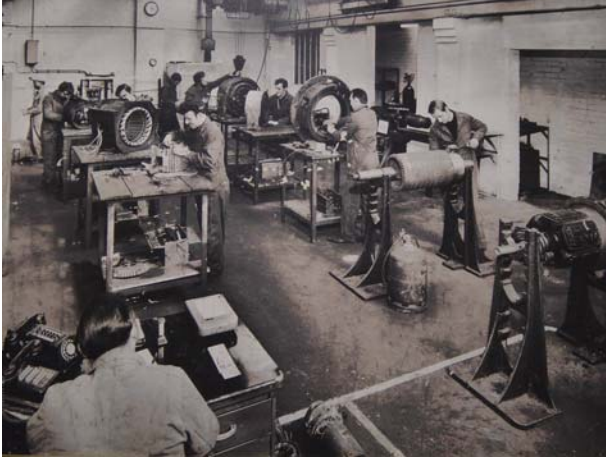


History of Bowers Electricals Ltd

The history of Bowers Electricals Ltd extends over 4 generations of the Bowers family in the Power Engineering Industry. The Bowers family were instigators in the creation and development of several large engineering companies, Laurie Bowers being managing director for 55years & David Bowers for 25years of one of the countries oldest power engineering plant supply companies.



In 1986 David Bowers purchased a motor rewind & new motor supply company called Electric Repairs (Nottm) Ltd, which had been in existence since 1947 and of which David had an old standing relationship with the owners. David Bowers felt the time was right to develop his own facility and once purchased, the company grew very quickly expanding its business into the additional markets of refurbishment and supplying Distribution Transformers, HV & LV switchgear and other associated equipment. This development meant that more storage for

electrical surplus was required and the company started to expand its storage and workshop facilities eventually purchasing a further site to expand its facilities.

In 1989 Michael Bowers joined the company as a sales manager dealing with the expanding sales of high voltage transformers and switchgear. In 1993 the company changed its name to Bowers Electricals Ltd

The company continued to expand and in 1994 purchased the present Heanor Gate Road site. The original Heanor workshops occupied 22,000 square feet plus the offices with substantial outside storage areas for storing the transformers and outdoor HV switchgear. Immediately after purchasing the site Bowers put in hand the building of another 10,000 square feet bay to consolidate its facility. In 1997 the company bought the Agate site, which is opposite the main Heanor works, bringing the total square footage of the two sites together to approximately 3.5 acres.



By the time of the purchase of the Heanor site Bowers had expanded its operations into providing large quantities of New HV & LV switchgear Transformers motors and associated equipment as well as their refurbished stocks and customer property overhaul. In 2000 Bowers Electricals moved into the Manufacture of their own Distribution & Power Transformers and in 2005 purchased a further winding company to allow expansion of their new Transformer business. Bowers also have created various other associated companies during its development.
